

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Here you can find responses to some frequently asked questions.

Queries Regarding Covid and Course Details

1. In view of the Covid-19 pandemic, will the classes take place online or offline?

The first semester classes will be held online. Teaching in the subsequent semesters will be made later and will be based on the pandemic situation at that time.

2. Is the Masters in Conservation Practice an online course or is it possible to do distance learning?

The course is not intended as an online course. The practice-oriented nature of the course and fieldwork components are not suited for distance learning.

3. How long is the course?

The course has a duration of two years, split into four semesters and more detail is on the [Coursework](#) tab of our webpage.

4. How many seats are available for the programme?

We don't have a fixed number of seats for the programme but are planning on a small class to facilitate quality faculty-student interactions.

Queries Regarding the Application Process and Eligibility

5. How do I enrol or apply for the course?

There are three stages to apply for the course: First, submit your application with all the required documents. Second, complete the entrance exam. Third, based on your application and entrance exam scores, you may be invited for a personal interview. 6. Does my degree make me eligible to apply?

Yes, students from diverse academic backgrounds are eligible to apply. For example, you could have a degree in Traditional Health Sciences, Biomedicine, Life Science,

Environmental Science, Design, Architecture, Performing and Fine Arts, Visual Communication, Economics, Geography, Anthropology, Social Work, Political Science, Mass Communication, Engineering and Management, or any other subject.

7. Is there an age limit for the candidates wishing to do the Masters in Conservation Practice?

There is no age limit on candidates.

Queries Regarding Costs of Program and Availability of Hostel

8. Is the fee mentioned on the website for the entire programme or for one academic year?

The fee mentioned on the website is for the entire program. You can find more details on the fee structure and the payment schedule [here](#). The course fee is 3,50,000 INR for Indian students. For students from SAARC countries, the fee is 16,130 USD. For applicants from other parts of the world, the fee is 19,850 USD.

9. Are there hostel facilities available? How much does it cost?

Yes, hostel facilities are available at ATREE and TDU and cost approximately 3000 INR per month.

Queries Regarding Careers and Placements

10. Is this masters course a part of an integrated PhD program?

No, but this masters program would ensure you are well-equipped to pursue a PhD degree at ATREE, or any other institution.

11. Are there placements after I finish the course? What are the job opportunities I have?

ATREE and TDU are in the process of formalising partnerships with corporates, NGOs, government and academic networks for internships and campus placements.
